We are so proud to have physicians of the highest caliber such as Dr. Robert A. Clarke as part of the White House community. Dr. Clarke is a beloved internist in East Orange and serves as our Subacute Medical Director.

Dr. Clarke grew up in the poorest part of Jamaica and watched many people die, including close relatives, due to the lack of healthcare. Already as a youngster, he had the passion to become a doctor so he could make
